

ADMISSION OF NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

The Board of Education affirms that its primary responsibility is to provide the best possible educational opportunities for the children who are legal district residents and who are of legal age to attend school.

However, a non-resident student may be admitted to district schools upon payment to the district of the Board-adopted tuition charge, if and only if, in the judgment of the Superintendent of Schools:

1. there is sufficient space to accommodate the non-resident student;
2. the non-resident student meets the district's criteria for admission; and
3. the admission of such non-resident student is and continues during the enrollment period to be in the best interests of the district.

Future Residents

The children of families who have signed a contract to buy or build a residence in the school district may be enrolled during the semester in which they expect to become residents, without payment of tuition.

Former Residents

Regularly enrolled children of families who have moved out of the school district during the second semester of the school year may complete that school year. Such children enrolled in grade 11 may complete both grade 11 and grade 12 without payment of tuition.

Children of Non-Resident Teachers

In order to attract qualified teachers from outside of the district, to reward non-resident teachers for teaching in our school system and to foster a greater interest by our non-resident teachers in quality education being offered by the district, children of non-resident teachers will be admitted to the district upon the following conditions:

1. Admission will be based on the availability of classroom space, as determined by the Superintendent, and at no cost to the district (to be certified by the Superintendent).
2. Admission and readmission will be subject to annual review and approval by the Superintendent at the beginning of each school year.
3. Placement will be for classes of regular instruction to be designated by the Superintendent or his/her designee. If such placement constitutes an additional cost to the district, placement shall be terminated upon thirty (30) days' notice to the parents of the student.

Transportation

Parents/Guardians will be responsible for the transportation of their children to and from home.

Home Instruction

The Board will not be responsible for home instruction to the non-resident student. If home instruction is needed because of injury or other events, the parent or guardian of the child shall arrange for instruction and the district will not be responsible to provide instructors.
