Children need healthy meals to learn!

All Hancock Central School District students are eligible to receive one breakfast and one lunch at no cost to families every regular school day during the 2023-2024 school year.

No-cost meals are possible this school year as HCSD participates in the USDA Food and Nutrition Service's National School Lunch and Breakfast programs. Additional meals and a la carte food items (milk, snacks, etc.) must be purchased on site or through online prepayments via MySchoolBucks.com.

Although no fees or forms are required for students to receive one no-cost breakfast and one no-cost lunch per school day, parents/guardians are strongly encouraged to complete and return a Community Eligibility Provision Household Income application (found on the school website) to help determine the amounts of other funds that benefit HCSD students.

Audit Notification

Periodically, the district receives audit reports from the External (Independent) Auditor and/or the Office of the New York State (NYS) Comptroller. The HCS Board of Education will review all audit recommendations in consultation with the audit committee and respond appropriately.

Independent and comptroller audit reports, and the accompanying management letters, will be made available for public inspection. Notice of the availability of independent and comptroller audit reports will be published in the district's official newspaper or one having general circulation in the district. If there is no newspaper, notice must be placed in ten (10) public places within the district. Additionally, final audit reports from the Office of the NYS Comptroller will be posted on the district website, if one is available, for a period of five (5) years.

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM HELPING HOUSEHOLDS CONNECT

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

The Affordable Connectivity Program provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for broadband service • Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider if the household contributes more than \$10 but less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Affordable Connectivity Program is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount

per household.



A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, or if a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below

- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year
- · Participates in the Free and reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision

- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income internet program · Participates in one of these assistance programs:
 - . SNAP
 - Medicaid
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - · WIC Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits
 - or Lifeline:
- · Participates in one of these assistance programs and lives on Qualifying Tribal lands Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
 - Tribal TANE
 - Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
- Tribal Head Start (income based)

TWO STEPS TO ENROLL

Step 1: Go to AffordableConnectivity.gov to submit an application or print out a mail-in application Step 2: Contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete. Eligible households must both apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.



Pesticide Use Notification

All schools are required to provide annual written notification to all staff and persons in parental relation regarding the potential use of pesticides throughout the school year. As a reminder, the Hancock Central School District is required to maintain a list of faculty, staff and persons in parental relation who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied continuously for 72 hours following an application
- Anti-microbial products
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams or gels in areas inaccessible to children
- Boric acid and disodium octa borate tetrahydrate
- The application of EPA-designated biopesticides
- The application of EPA-designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects, including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health. a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list. If you would like to receive 48-hour prior notification of pesticide applications in your school, or if you would like more information about the products being used, please contact:
